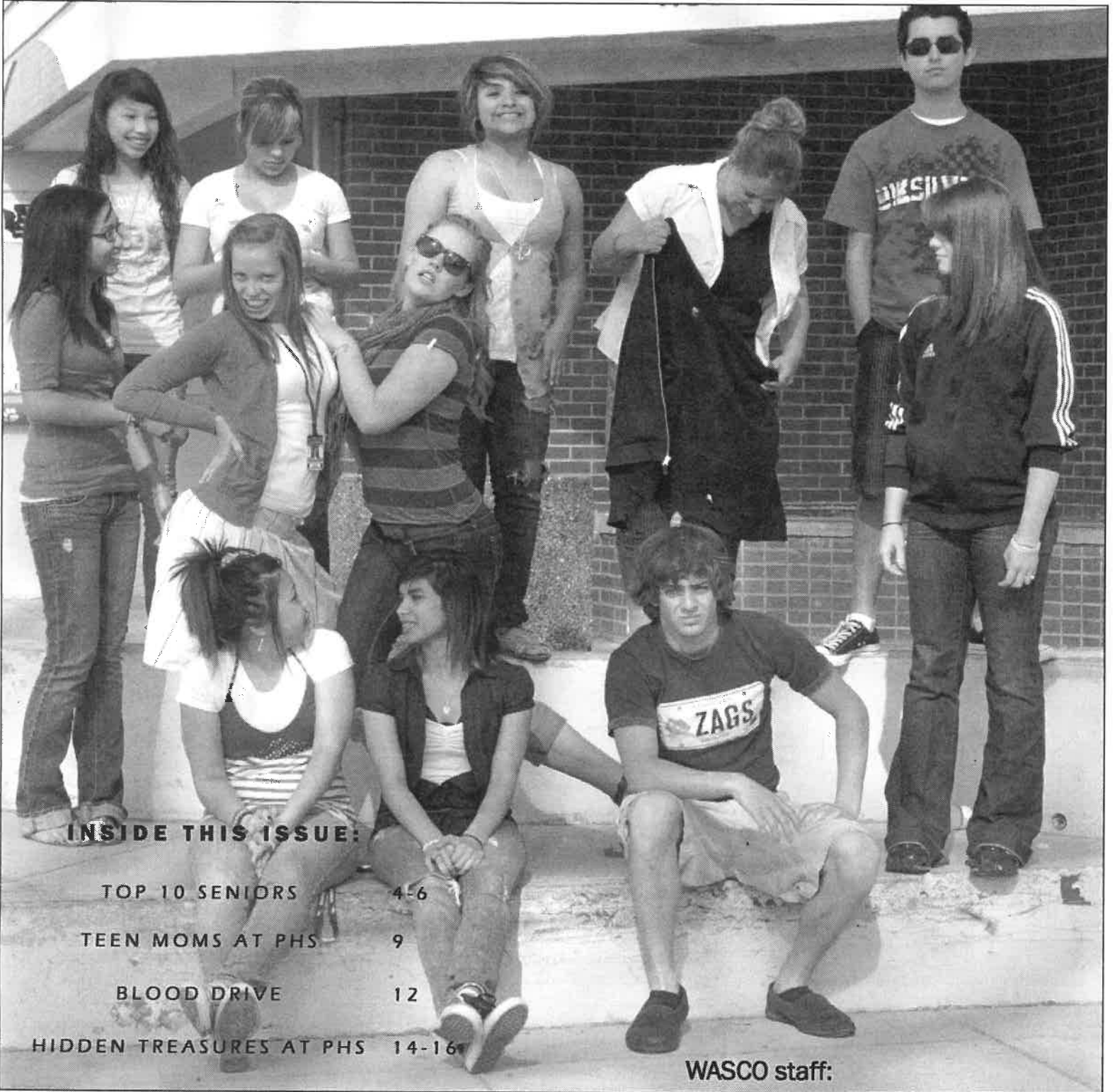

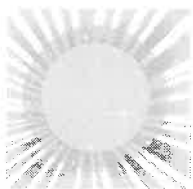
FFA Plant Sale by Jessica Lepe

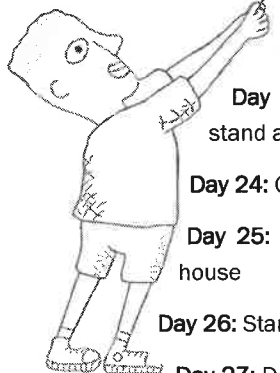

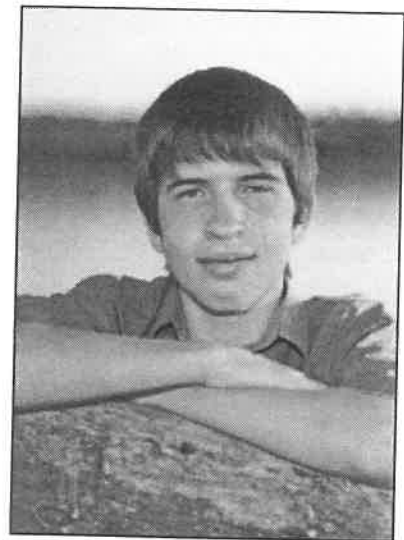
and National Honors Society.

Jennifer plans to attend Washington State University in Pullman while majoring in mathematics.

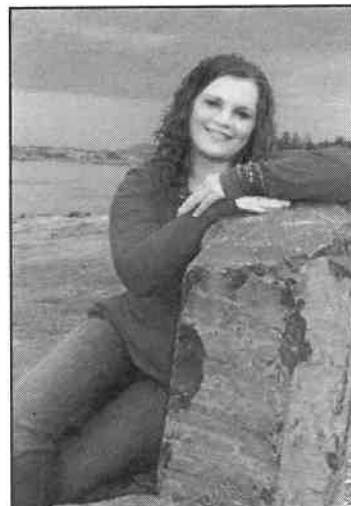

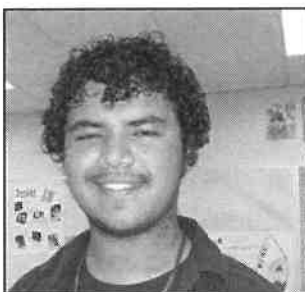
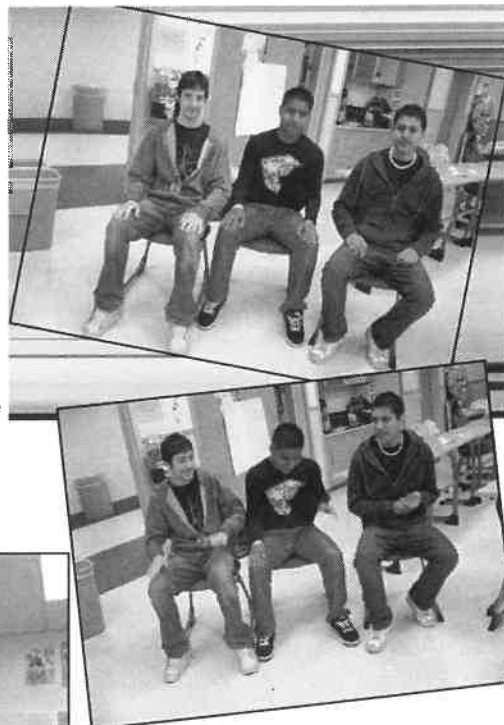
The students who participated are Mario Lazaro, Misael Rosas, Kevin Garcia, and Jesus Padilla. How they got involved in the contest

giving it their best, and giving PHS a chance at our own way of stomping the yard. Good job!

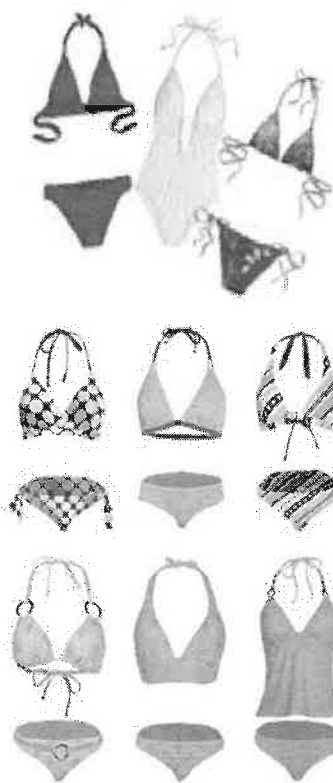


Scholarship Winner!

So if you find yourself in this situation, before you give up, or drop out, think about the choices and options that you have. As stressful and hard as it is, it is still possible to be a successful student and mom.

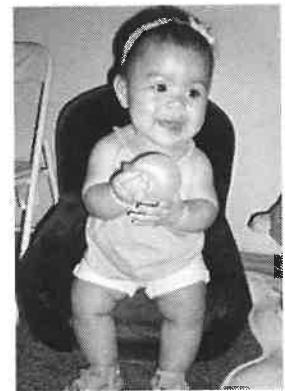

TODAY, I DIED AND I NEVER GOT THE CHANCE TO TELL YOU.....

This is the statement that 26 Pasco High seniors were struggling to finish on April 29th, 2010 as they "died" that day. For the remainder of the school day, these 26 souls roamed the hallways and classrooms as the dead.

Every 15 Minutes is a program that teaches awareness about the hazards of drinking and driving. Seniors that participated not only get taken to the afterlife by the Grim Reaper, but also participate in an over-

night program and then put on an assembly for the senior class the following morning.

At first, most had the same thought: that this program was just a chance to get dressed in a Halloween costume and run around school. They soon realized that the Every 15 Minutes program is so much more and, in fact, is no laughing matter.

"Every 15 Minutes makes you aware that you need to think before you act" says senior

Jessica Jaimes. She feels that participating in this program will make a statement to others not to drink and drive.

"I thought wow, it would really affect people if I was gone in a way I didn't think it would. My friends found it hard not to be able to talk to me" says senior Luis Vergara.
