Thespians To Produce Three One-Act Plays

"Entertainment at its best" is to be presented for you on the evening of October 20 at 8 o'clock in the auditorium of Pasco High School. Humor and drama will be presented in a series of three one-act plays. Those students portraying the different character parts in the plays were selected at the all-school tryout held on September 24 and 25.

Girls who are to usher are **Joyce Hue, Joan Whitby, Diane Benson, Pat Smith and Carroll Larson**. Thespians selling tickets are **Linda Williams, Julia Whitby, and Tom Webb**.

Thespians who head the make-up crew are: **Linda Martin, Karen Stampe, Carol Martin, Marcia Wooly, Linda Case, Bev Hampton, Joyce Hue and Carroll Larson**.

The publicity committee consist of **Carroll Larson**, chairman; **Linda Case, Linda Martin, Stana Taylor, and Billie Dyer**.

The ever active stage crew who are to help behind the scenes are **Bill Cowell**, stage manager; **Miles Jaeger, Brian Putra, Derick Baker, and Bob Loveland**.

The first of the three one-act plays is an old fashioned "mellerdramma" entitled "Curse You, Jack Dalton." It is directed by **Les Bailey**. His assistant is **Stana Taylor**. As the curtain rises we see **Bertha**, the maid (**Margie White**), in the home of a very high brow aristocratic woman, **Mrs. Dalton**, who is portrayed by **Sally Myers**. Aunt Anna, (**Mary Winkler**) is out to get the money of our hero, (**Jack Dalton**). The hero loves the pretty maid, even at the point of rejecting his mother and ignoring Anna. But all is not smooth sailing, because a villain appears on the scene, **Egbert Van Horh (Max Towne)**, who threatens the fair **Bertha**. All this leads to an exciting climax. The prompters are **Judy Guyer and Ilene Grant**.

The second play to be presented is a serious drama written by **Donald Elser**, and directed by **Jerry Bracy**. Assistant Director is **Billie Kay Dyer**. The setting of the play is on the balcony of a church at a funeral and is entitled "Balcony Scene." This fantasy takes place at the funeral of a Ne'er-do-well. The spirit of the dead man (**Chris Jones**) is escorted to the balcony by his friend (**Pete Loraine**).

Others who attend the funeral are a gangster (**Ray Amstadt**), his mother (**Rose Halverson**), a spoiled daughter (**Penny Seaver**), a most domineering wife (**Les Lee Hellickson**), and her hen-pecked husband (**Jan Peterson**). Also, the girl whom the man was to

marry (**Marie Anderson**) is present. He pleads with his friend to be allowed to speak to the girl. Defending his past, he cries out that "Everyone likes me. Everyone!" In a blend of pathos, philosophy and ironic humor the play unfolds. This is an award winning play and is certain to be enjoyed by all. **Kathryn Perry and Judy Jump** are prompters.

From serious drama our minds are flung into the hurly-burly of a schoolroom and all the comedy of a top-rate play. **Luke Townsbury's** play, "An Apple For the Teacher," is dramatized in the classroom of any small town school in the U.S.A. This hilarious comedy is directed by **Don Essinger** and assistant director is **Carroll Larson**. **Alicia Peabody (Jamelyn Lisk)**, the richest girl in school, makes the fatal mistake of tattling on "Swat" **Simmons (Dave Whitmire)**, the toughest boy in school. Swat vows to have vengeance. **Esther Baker (Carol Ransdell)**, the harassed young teacher, and **Carter Drake (Ron Bracy)**, a handsome principal announce their intention of getting married. The school board appoints a new teacher, **Meta Battler (Valoria Hammer)**, who comes well prepared for her new assignment. Students in the play are **Dixie Duke (Wanita Dunbar)**, **Dodie Smart (Jerry Lynn Bell)**, **Liz Farley (Janet Sutherland)**, "Shrimp" **Madison (Keith Snider)**, **Ida Brodsky (Marilyn Kanester)**, **Irma Eyeful (Brenda Struthers)**, "Fatso" **Barnes (Lyle Crater)** and "Flutterby" **Fair (Larry Krueger)**. Also in the play is **Mrs. Palmer Peabody (Sandra Hansen)**. The prompters for this play are **Karen Moody and Patsy Olson**.

For an evening of moving drama, and ironic humor, be sure to attend the three one-act plays next Tuesday.

Jayvees Subdued By Walla Walla FTA To Hold Initiation

The Pasco Bullpups were host to the hardhitting Walla Walla junior varsity Monday afternoon. The game, played at Brown Memorial Stadium at 2:30, ended in an 8-0 victory for the Walla Walla team.

The only T.D. of the afternoon came in the third period of play when Walla Walla broke through the left tackle and went for a 45-yard touchdown run.

The Bullpups, working under coach **Russ Wiseman**, played in two separate teams, the offensive team included **Luther James and Dave Blevens** at ends, **Jim Chubb and Roy Linders** at tackle, **Loren Larson and Clark Romans** trading off at the quarterback position, and **Roy Avery and Bob Cleveland** holding down the left and right halfback spots respectively. **Tim Emmons and Rudy Terrin** took turns in the fullback position, while **Pat Horsley and Mike Phillips** guarded. **Doyle Clapper** was the center for the offensive team. **Dave Whitmire** went in for **James** in the first quarter.

Defensive-wise, Pasco was well protected with tough players like **Roy McMahan** and **Pete Hansen** guarding the line. **Terry Zier and Jim Chubb** handled the tackle positions with an assist from **Dave Blevens and Dave Whitmire** at the ends. **Jim Richardson** played center.

In the backfield, **Bob Cleveland and James Beard** were at left and right half, with **Brad Blakeley and Mel Louk** doing the line backing. **Clark Romans** was the safety man for the defense.

Carroll's Corner

Enthusiasm! A remarkable word! The ancient Greeks used it to describe an inspired person. The enthusiastic person, they thought, was one who reflected the presence of an indwelling god. And the more you ponder this, the more convinced you become that the Greeks, as usual, not only had a word for it, but the right word.

What, exactly is it? I would define it as the ability to react with eagerness. The enthusiastic person has the capacity of generating excitement about ideas, people, events, anything. He feels things. He CARES. And as he cares, he is alive — just as when you stop caring altogether you are dead.

Where does it come from, this power, this capacity to react with gladness? I suspect that it is built into all of us, that each of us starts out in life with an adequate supply. Most young things, from colts to kittens, seem to be handsomely endowed with it. The problem is how to retain it once the freshness and eagerness of youth are past.

Certain inevitable aspects of living seem to be the enemy of enthusiasm. Routine deadens it, familiarity dulls it.

From my window, as I write this, I can see a disdainful cat walking along the top of a fence. Just a plain alley-cat, nothing to be excited about. But suppose I had never seen a cat before. Suppose this incredibly graceful creature was the ONLY cat in existence. Imagine, then, the excitement he would cause, the price he would command!

Each of us as SOME spark of enthusiasm! Some of us let it grow dim under the dust of daily living. Some of us, like the man in the parable of the talents, hoard it jealously, bury it for safekeeping deep within ourselves. This is a mistake. Enthusiasm needs to be expressed. People who give free rein to their enthusiasm will never run short of it, for by so doing they are constantly adding to their supply.

Enthusiasm: The greatest gift in the world! But to keep it, you have to give it away.

Look around you, watch your classmates and see how many of them REALLY possess enthusiasm or (as we often say) instead: Class Spirit.

How many of them seem always to be doing something for the good of the school? How many are always encouraging others around them to be enthusiastic with the use of their own enthusiasm? Look around you—it's a quality that can be spotted in a glance.

Zinc—Where you wash your hands.

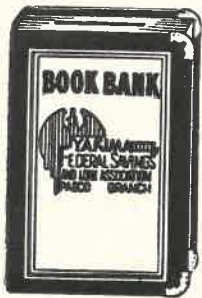

Book-Bank deposits will be accepted at your first class in all schools, Tuesday, October 20.

Book-Banks may be brought in to your school classroom for deposit of contents, on regular deposit days, but you need not bring them in until filled, unless you so desire. When bringing in your Book-Bank, be sure to bring in your pass-book for entry of the amount of your deposit therein by the Association representative, after which both the pass-book and Book-Bank will be returned to you.

These Savings Accounts are insured up to \$10,000.00 and will participate on a pro rata basis in our regular dividends which are declared as of December 31st and June 30th, each year.

(Note to Parents—This Book-Bank Savings plan was inaugurated to fill the need for a thrift program to supplement the Thrift and Savings plan that our Government formerly carried on, thru the Schools in the War Stamp and Bond drives.

Playing possibly their best ball game of the season, the Pasco Bulldogs were subdued by the Bombers of Richland 32-20 in a conference game played here October 9.

The Bombers, led by full-back **Dennis Waltman**, proved too much for the Pasco team, trying for their first win of the season. However, they found out early in the game that the Pasco Bulldogs were not an easy team to beat.

Richland held the lead through most of the game, scoring the first T.D. in the beginning quarter.

Steve Smith managed to block Richland's punt attempt and tackle **Tom Brandon** recovered the ball, carrying it to the Richland 20 before being upset. After **Ray Amstadt** and **Clark Henderson** moved the ball to the half-yard line, Amstadt plunged over for the first Bulldog score. He also kicked for the conversion, giving the Bulldogs a 7-6 lead.

Richland returned **Randy Schultz's** kickoff 28 yards before being stopped. Working mostly from the ground, the Bombers were able to push the Pasco defense back, until they managed a sneak from 3 yards out, again putting Richland in the lead. The conversion kick was blocked this time by **Brad Blakeley**.

With only 13 seconds left in the half, Richland picked up another T.D., bringing the half-time score to 18-7.

Pasco received the Bomber kickoff and returned the ball to the 30 yard line. Two plays later, Pasco end **Alan Hoover** snagged a 35-yard pass from **Amstadt**, behind Richland defenses, and ran the distance for another Bulldog touchdown. The extra point kick was no good.

With only a five point lead, the Bombers were forced into action, and with 3:51 left in the third period, managed to score a touchdown. **Waltman** scored the conversion run.

In the final period of the game, Pasco staged a sustained ground drive, with **Amstadt** sprinting 40 yards before being stopped. This put the ball on the Richland 1½ yard line.

Two plays later, **Amstadt** crashed over the Bomber defenses for the final T.D. of the game for the Bulldogs. His booted conversion put the score at 25-20.

Tonight, the Pasco Bulldogs will meet the Shelton High Climbers of Shelton, Wash., in a non-conference game at the Edgar Brown Memorial Stadium.

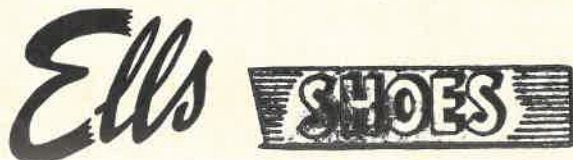
